

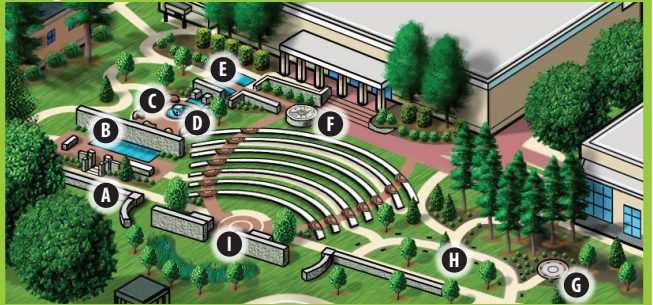

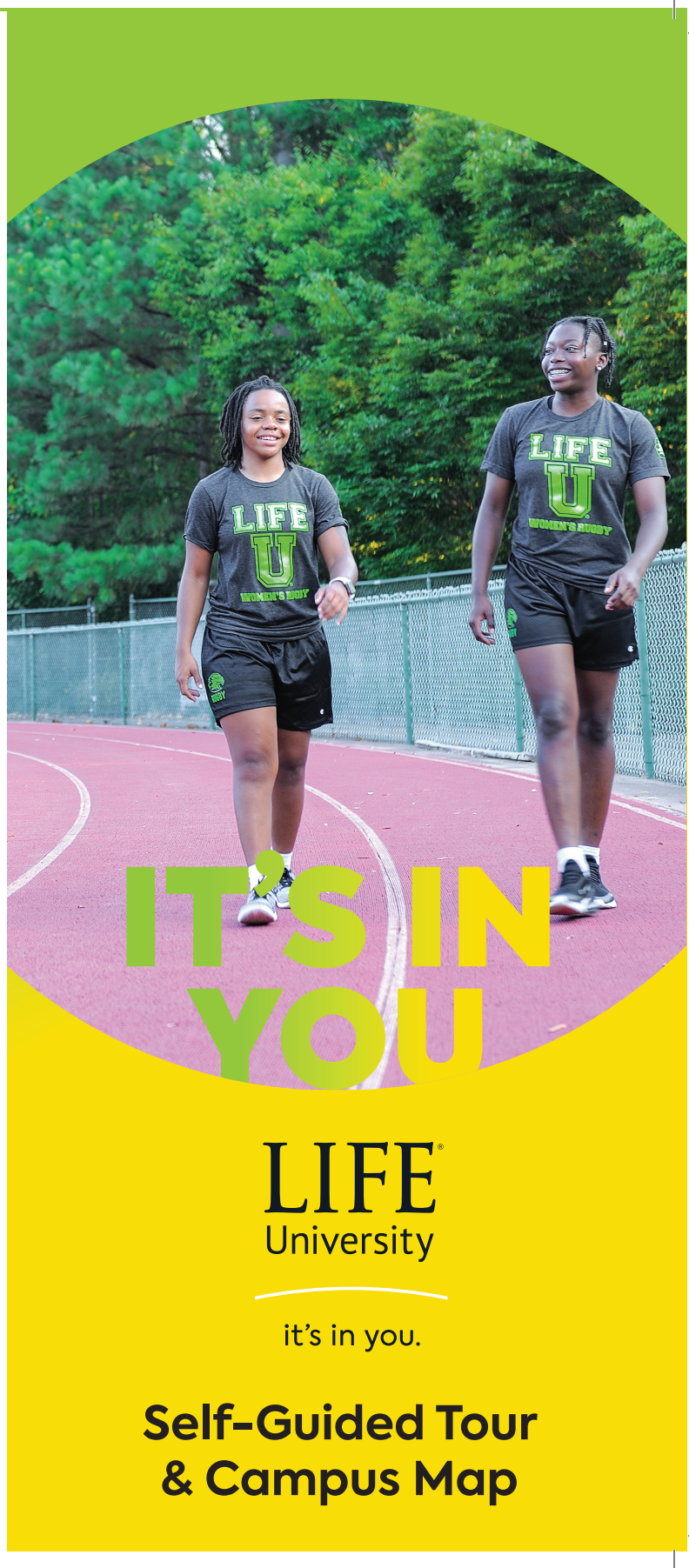

LIFE VILLAGE RETREAT

"The Retreat," as it is known, is a student housing center that is LEED Gold-Level Certified for sustainable construction. It contains all the amenities desired by today's students, including Wi-Fi, cable television and laundry facilities in every unit.



WILLIAM M. HARRIS CENTER FOR CLINICAL EDUCATION

The Harris Center contains a 23-room Assessment Center, a computer Mastery Testing Center, and Diagnostic Imaging and Alignment area, as well as the Campus Center for Health & Optimum Performance and Dr. Sid E. Williams Research Center.



THE COMMONS

The Commons student housing accommodates 362 students, as well as the Lyceum Dining Hall, a 200-seat, "all-you-can-eat," buffet style eatery.



SAFETY PIN

The Safety Pin at LIFE serves as a chiropractic symbol. Remaining open, it serves as a daily reminder to educate and care for the world, in efforts to reconnect individuals with their innate and optimal potential (thereby "closing" the pin).



LYCEUM PARK

Lyceum Park is the nerve center of Life U's campus, with multiple features that include the Standard Process Amphitheatre, Path of Heroes and other areas of contemplation and reflection.

LASTING PURPOSE (LP)

To Give, To Do, To Love, To Serve—Out of a Sense of Abundance—Life College was founded on the philosophy that by working from a center of gratitude, our inherent gifts are used for the benefit of others to create a cycle of goodwill. Today, Life University strives to inspire every student and employee to make a personal commitment to serving Lasting Purpose in all areas of life.

VITALISM POOL

Life University defines Vitalism as "the understanding and principle that all organic systems in the universe are conscious, self-developing, self-maintaining and self-healing." The Vitalism Pool is a symbolic representation of the natural, vital source within that allows us to heal, grow and adapt to leading lives of optimal performance and significance.

EIGHT CORE PROFICIENCIES

Each stone marker within the circle reflects one of Life University's Eight Core Proficiencies. These values are integral to a LIFE education, charging our students to not only become highly skilled professionals, but to strive to become model citizens and leaders in their communities and beyond.

REFLECTION POOLS

LIFE's campus is designed to support our commitment to vitalistic wellness, and the twin reflection pools are just one area created to inspire us to take some quiet, peaceful moments to nurture our emotional, intellectual and spiritual health.

SOAP BOX

Inspired by the famed soap box speeches in Hyde Park, London, LIFE's very own stone "soap box" serves as a platform from which members of the LIFE community can inspire profound, thought-provoking discussions that will lead the vital health revolution.

WELLNESS LIFESTYLE

This area serves as a reminder of Life University's commitment to total wellness, which is defined as a balance of six key aspects of health—Physical, Intellectual, Emotional, Social, Environmental and Spiritual. Together, these six dimensions form the foundation of the Wellness Lifestyle, which influences everything we do at LIFE.

PATH OF HEROES

Inlaid with the hand- and footprints of Life University's founders and other leaders of the chiropractic profession, the Path of Heroes honors those who have made—and continue to make—history in the chiropractic profession. The Path of Heroes serves to remind the LIFE community and its visitors that as they travel through campus, they are following in the footsteps of those who have paved the way.

STANDARD PROCESS AMPHITHEATRE

The amphitheatre is named in honor of a generous gift from Standard Process, Inc. Designed with natural acoustics and a state-of-the-art audio system, the Standard Process Amphitheatre provides a unique venue for concerts, lectures, movies, plays and other events. The natural stone seating is popular with students who come to study, socialize, enjoy lunch or pause for a break between classes.



LEARNING RESOURCE CENTER

The Learning Resource Center houses the Drs. Sid E. & Nell K. Williams Library, as well as the Student Advocacy and Advisement Center, Financial Aid and Enrollment.

The CGUS is the home of graduate and undergraduate studies at Life U.

SOCRATES CAFÉ

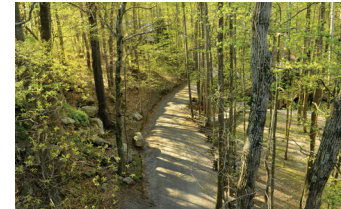
LIFE UNIVERSITY ATHLETICS COMPLEX

WILLIAM M. HARRIS MEMORIAL

William M. Harris, D.C. was one of Chiropractic's—and Life U's—greatest benefactors. This memorial honors Dr. Harris, his life, his work and his legacy through the Harris Family Foundation.



FITNESS TRAIL

More than five miles of wooded trails wind through campus, providing opportunities for recreation, reflection and connection with the natural environment.



CENTER FOR ATHLETICS & SPORT HEALTH

The Center for Athletics & Sport Health Science building houses the degree programs of the Sport Health Science Department, along with two full-sized gymnasiums (one of which transforms into the TIC Auditorium). The Athletics Department is also housed here.



19TH CENTURY VILLAGE

Take a walk down the wooded path and be transported to a different time and place. This tranquil village contains actual 19th-century structures, including a fully functional grist mill.



BELL TOWER

This campus landmark is a monument to the pioneers of Chiropractic. In the early days of the profession, chiropractors were sometimes jailed for practicing "medicine" without a license. The names inscribed on the interior walls of the Tower honor all those who suffered the indignity of imprisonment for helping their fellow citizens.



SIDNEY E WILLIAMS, D.C. MEMORIAL

Dr. Sidney E. Williams, Life U's first President, and defender of the chiropractic principle, is memorialized here with an eternal flame.



TOLERANCE MONUMENT

A monument that resembles the Olympic Torch, Tolerance reminds the Life U community that one of the highest and noblest aspirations a human being can attain is tolerance for others' beliefs, values, ideals and creeds.



IAN GRASSAM TREEHOUSE

A student retreat among the trees, this peaceful setting is a perfect place to study during the week or to relax on weekends.
